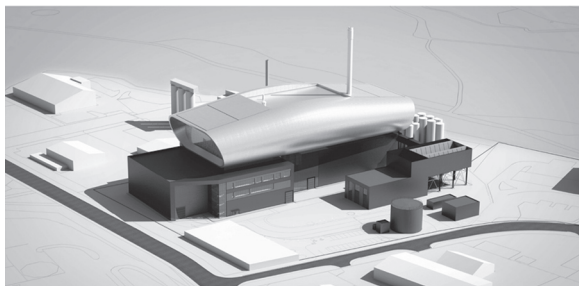


East Tullis Energy from Waste Project Update

The planning application to develop a £150 million Energy from Waste facility at East Tullis in south Aberdeen has been submitted to Aberdeen City Council.



Three public exhibitions were held on 29th February, 1st and 2nd March in Torry and at the Aberdeen Altens Hotel where further details of the proposal were presented to the public.

Members of the public now have the opportunity to make representations to Aberdeen City Council as part of the statutory consultation process. More information about how to do this is available online at www.aberdeencity.gov.uk/planning. The reference number for this application is 160276.

The proposed development will process non-recyclable municipal waste from Aberdeen City as well as neighbouring local authorities, Aberdeenshire and Moray. Under a first stage Inter-Authority

Agreement, the three Councils are working in partnership to undertake initial project and procurement development work for the proposed facility.

The proposed development would generate heat and power from waste that cannot be recycled, providing secure, low-cost energy to households, businesses and council facilities in the area.

If permission is granted, the plant is expected to be operational around 2021.

In March, a group of representatives from Torry, Nigg, Kincorth & Leggart and Cove & Altens Community Councils visited a similar facility in Lincoln as part of their role in the Stakeholder

Group which has been established as part of the project.
