## **POLICE**

The Nigg Community Policing Team has been busy in recent weeks dealing with a variety of different issues. One area of concern we are actively targeting is speeding and inappropriate driving behaviour on residential streets. As new Officers join the team, they are being trained in the use of speed

detection equipment and deployed to 'hot spots' such as the Coast Road, Langdykes Road, Gardner Drive and Leggart Terrace. We have also had reports of speeding on Redmoss Road near to Checkbar, and of inconsiderate drivers using the wrong lane on roundabouts to get home a bit quicker during rush hour. Every one of these areas will be patrolled by the team and where offences are detected, drivers will be dealt with.

Constable Davis has been investigating a report of fly-tipping at the Cove Harbour, where a male was seen dumping building materials into the water at the end of the Pier. This kind of behaviour is clearly unacceptable and positive lines of enquiry are being followed.

The derelict Farm House at Mains of Loirston is known to be a popular place for local young people to gather during the summer. In recent weeks, Emergency Services have been called to a report of fires being lit in this area. The Nigg Community Policing Team has contacted the owners of the Farm House and is working to make the area safe. In the meantime, please stay away from the building.

This month Officers from the Nigg Community Policing Team took on a team comprising of Staff and Children from the Kincorth Children's Home in a game of football. The game was arranged to provide the children with a diversionary activity and a means for the police to engage positively with a partner agency. The match, which finished 9 -4 to the police, was hard fought and a lot closer than the score suggests. It was a fantastic day and thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who took part.

Officers working as part of Operation Trinity, targeting anti-social and illegal use of motorcycles, continue to work from the Nigg Police Office. The Operation to date has been highly successful with numerous bikes seized and drivers charged. The support of the Community is vital to the success of the Operation and we ask that you report all sightings of motorcycles being used illegally or in an anti-social manner on public streets or open spaces.
