GAGAH was established in 1999 with the sole aim of raising awareness about the plight of racing greyhounds and ex-working lurchers and to save as many of these wonderful hounds as we can.

GAGAH is a Non-Profit Organisation, solely run by a dedicated team of volunteers who give their time and effort for free. Every penny donated to GAGAH goes to helping us save more lives and to look after the dogs we already have in our care. We have found homes for several thousand of these adorable hounds, where they are loved and get the chance to have a happy, well deserved retirement.

We can accommodate 6 dogs at our Maud Kennels in rural Aberdeenshire and 3 at the Hope kennels nearby at Memsie we also have foster homes who look after another 4-5 hounds.

Over 10,000 greyhounds retire each year EVERY year, with fewer than 2,000 being rehomed, the rest are sadly put to sleep before they reach 4 years old.

Felicity is a young, small lurcher around 4 years old. She has not had the best start in life. When she was rescued from the pound, she was very thin and her claws were curled round into her pads, so she was obviously not walked for a very long time. She is now in a foster home with another greyhound and is doing really well, her pads are healing and she is now able to go on walks. She is great with children. Her foster mom says that she is great with her two year old twins and is very gentle around them. She is excellent in the house and walks nicely on the lead. Due to her previous lack of walking/socialisation she is not keen meeting other dogs on walks at the moment, but she is improving daily with the help of her foster mom. Felicity gets on very well with her foster sister. She is a very friendly, happy, playful little girl. She loves to sleep, have cuddles and rarely barks. Would suit a rural location with another dog, the new owners would need to slowly introduce her to the existing dog(s) and then she will be fine.
