Get ready for the 2015 Library Summer Reading Challenge!

The Tesco Bank Summer Reading Challenge Scotland takes place in all City Libraries again this year with the exciting new theme of Record Breakers and runs from Friday 3 July until Saturday 22 August.

The Challenge encourages children to read up to six books from their local library over the summer holidays. Any library book can be read - from picture books to audio books – and children will receive stickers and rewards throughout the Challenge.

This year's 'Record Breakers' theme and the collaboration with Guinness World Records brings together fact and fiction and challenges readers to explore real-life achievements and world records. Readers will discover weird, wonderful and wacky records from around the world in six different categories: Cool Tech, Way to Go!, The Big Stuff, Animal Magic, Action! Adventure! and People Power.
