## **JULY**

***Wednesday 15 July – 10am-1pm  
Pooling Our Ponds  
Kingswells***

The Kingswells pond was dredged during the winter to increase the area of open water for pond life. We would like to see how this work has increased the biodiversity of the pond. To do this we are inviting members of the public to join the Countryside Rangers for an afternoon of pond dipping and recording what we find. Please bring wellies if you have them. Meet outside the Co-op at Kingswells shops on Kingswood Drive.
